Proposed Data Elements

Specified in Statute <u>Additional Elements Proposed in Regs</u> 1. ORI number (agency ID) 1. Type of stop 2. Time of Stop 3. Date of Stop 2. Reason for presence at scene 4. Location of Stop 5. Reason for Stop 3. Whether person stopped has limited 6. Result of Stop English fluency or a pronounced accent 7. Specific warning or citation issued 8. Specific offense charged 4. Whether person stopped has perceived 9. Perceived race or ethnicity or known disability 10. Perceived gender 11. Perceived approximate age 5. Unique identifier assigned to officer 12. Actions taken during stop 13. Whether officer asked for consent to 6. Officer's years of experience as peace search person officer 14. Whether consent was provided 15. Whether officer searched person or 7. Officer's type of assignment property 16. Basis for any search 17. Type of contraband or evidence discovered, if any 18. Whether officer seized property 19. Elements Considered But Not Included in Proposed Regulations

- 1. Perceived sexual orientation
- 2. Perceived religious affiliation
- 3. Perceived homeless status
- 4. Whether stop was officer-initiated
- 5. Whether officer had previous contact with individual
- 6. Whether officer inquired regarding individual's immigration status

- 7. Number of officers present at scene
- 8. Whether officers were in uniform and/or patrol cars
- Number of civilians present during stop
- 10. Race or ethnicity of officer
- 11. Age of officer
- 12. Gender of officer
- 13. Open narrative field for officer to explain, in own words, reason for stop

Review of Several Data Elements Currently in Proposed Regulations

Reason for Presence at Scene of Stop

- 1. Patrol
- 2. Radio calls/dispatch (requests for service)
 - a. Radio dispatch regarding suspicious/criminal activity
 - b. Radio dispatch with description of suspect
 - c. Citizen call for assistance
 - d. Other
- 3. Witness interviews
- 4. Citizen-initiated contact

- **5.** Warrants/programmatic operations
 - a. Execution of search warrant
 - b. Execution of arrest warrant
 - c. DUI sobriety checkpoint or other roadblock
 - d. Traffic control
 - e. Crowd control
 - f. Building or event security function (e.g., metal detectors)
 - g. Other
- 6. Welfare check
- 7. Other community caretaking
- 8. K-12 public school assignment
- 9. Civil disorder
- 10. Other

Reason for Stop

1. Traffic violation

- A. Vehicle Code Section
- B. If driver
- a. moving violation
- b. equipment violation
- c. status violation

2. Reasonable suspicion

- A. Code §
- B. Basis
- a. Person matched suspect description
- b. Witness or victim identification of suspect at scene
- c. Carrying suspicious object
- d. Person taking actions indicative of casing a victim or location

2. Reasonable Suspicion (cont.)

- e. Person suspected of acting as a lookout
- f. Person taking actions indicative of a drug transaction
- g. Person taking actions indicative of engaging in a violent crime
- h. Person carrying objects in plain view used in a commission of crime
- i. Other reasonable suspicion
- 3. Probable cause to arrest (Code §)
- 4. Probable cause to search
- 5. Parole/probation/PRCS/mandatory supervision
- 6. Consensual encounter resulting in consensual search.

Actions Taken by Officer During Stop

- 1. Person removed from vehicle by order or physical contact
- 2. Field sobriety check conducted
- 3. Curbside detention
- 4. Handcuffed
- 5. Patrol car detention
- 6. Use of canine in apprehension
- 7. Weapon removed from holster or brandished

- 8. Weapon discharged or used (specify weapon type)
- 9. Other use of force
- 10. Asked for consent to search person
 - a. Consent given
- 11. Search of person was conducted
- 12. Asked for consent to search property
 - a. Consent given
- 13. Search of property conducted
- 14. Property seized
- 15. None of the above

Result of Stop

- 1. No action
- 2. Warning (indicate verbal or written)
- 3. Citation for infraction
- 4. Cite and release
- 5. Custodial arrest
- 6. Custody (other than arrest), referral or transport:
 - a) Psychiatric hold
 - b) Civil protective custody

- 6. Custody, etc. (cont.)
 - c) Transported for medical treatment
 - d) Transported to custody of school official
 - e) Transported to custody of family member
 - f) Community caretaking transport
 - g) Referred to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services
 - h) Other
- 7. Person stopped died during encounter with officer

Information Regarding Officer

- Officer's Unique Identifier:
 - Permanent unique identification number assigned by LEA to officer
 - Prohibition on Disclosure [11 CCR § 999.228(f)]:
 - "The Department will not release the Officer's Unique Identifier to the public because doing so could lead to the disclosure of the peace officer's badge number, identity, and other unique identifying information."
- ➤ Officer's Years of Experience
- **➢** Officer's Assignment Type

Special Settings

- Traffic Control, Mass Evacuations, Active Shooter Events, Crowd Control, Witness Interviews
- Programmatic Searches or Seizures (Examples: Checkpoint/roadblocks, Routine Security Screenings (e.g., Metal Detectors, Routine Bag or Person Check at Building or Event Entrances)
- Interactions in K-12 Settings
- Passengers in Vehicle Stops
- Searches/Arrests of Person Subject to Warrant or Search Condition in Home
- Interactions During Home Detention or House Arrest Assignment

Review: Actions Taken by Officer During Stop

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K -12 Public School Setting Reportable Interactions with <u>Students</u>

1. Category 1

- Results in temporary custody (WIC 625)
- Citation
- Arrest
- Permanent seizure of property as evidence of criminal offense
- Referral to school administrator because of suspected criminal activity

2. Category 2

Student questioned to investigate whether committed violation of law

• 3. Category 3

Student questioned to investigate if violated EC 48900, 48900.2, 48900.3, 48900.4, and 48900.7

4. Category 4

Student is subject to any "Actions Taken by Officer During Stop"

K-12 Public School Setting Additional Data Values to Report
